Privacy

The protection of your personal data is a priority for us. This information notice provides you with the necessary information and explains to you how we collect, use, share, store and protect your personal information. It also informs you of your rights and how to exercise them.


The Luxembourg Department of Media, Telecommunications and Digital Policy (“Service des Médias et des Communications”, hereafter “SMC”), 5 rue Plaetis, L-2338 Luxembourg is the Controller of your personal data processed by us. In this capacity, we are responsible for the way in which we collect, use, share, store and protect your personal data.

We collect and use the personal data that you provide based you voluntarily provide, in order to ensure your registration as a participant to the “Connecting Tomorrow Conference”, your visibility as a speaker, and to provide you, if you choose so, with online networking functionalities. The personal information we collect is: identification data (name, surname and contact data).

We automatically collect certain information when you visit or use the conference’s platform. This information does not reveal your specific identity (like your name or contact information) but may include device and usage information (such as your IP address, browser and device characteristics operating system, language preference). Our processor, InEvent, provides us with event platform services. This information is primarily needed to maintain the security and operation of the platform, and for internal analytics and reporting purposes. Please also refer to the “cookies policy”, below.

You can also access the conference via our processor’s App (if you choose to use it). By using the App, some information may be collected, for the App to function (such as mobile device information), or based on your consent (for instance to access your mobile device’s calendar, or for receiving push notifications). Concerning the latter, please check your device’s settings if you want to change your preferences.

We ensure that your personal data are processed with due regard for the purposes indicated above. These data are shared with our processor, InEvents, subject to strict observance of the tasks assigned to it. Your data are processed by us and our processor, whose servers are based in Dublin, Ireland. The period for which data are retained is limited to the period of use of the conference’s platform and for as long as data need to be retained in order for us to fulfil our obligations resulting from the limitation periods and/or any other legal provisions.




How to contact us and exercise your rights

As data subject, you have specific data protection rights under the applicable legislation. That includes, within the limits of this legislation, that you have the right:

- of access to the personal data we hold concerning you and request a copy of it,
- of rectification of the data if they are inaccurate or incomplete,
- of erasure in certain cases, such as, for example, whenever your data are no longer necessary for the purpose pursued and we don't have any contractual or legal obligation to store data anymore,
- to request the restriction of processing of your personal data, such as for example the restriction of processing of data of which you contest the accuracy, for the period enabling us to verify your request,
- to withdraw your consent at any time to the processing of your personal data without this affecting the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given prior to withdrawal (unless the processing has a legal basis other than your consent).

Cookies

This Cookie Policy explains how our conference's platform is put in shape by our processor, InEvent, and uses cookies and similar technologies to recognize you when you visit the platform. It explains what these technologies are and why we use them, as well as your rights to control our use of them.

Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies are widely used by website owners in order to make their websites work, or to work more efficiently, as well as to provide reporting information.

Cookies set directly by us are called 'first party cookies'. Cookies set by parties other than us are called 'third party cookies'. Third party cookies enable third party features or functionality to be provided on or through the platform (e.g. like interactive content and analytics). The parties that set these third party cookies can recognize your computer both when it visits the website in question and also when it visits certain other websites.

We use first and third party cookies for several reasons. Some cookies are required for technical reasons in order for our platform to operate, and we refer to these as 'essential' or 'strictly necessary' cookies. Third parties may serve cookies through our platform for advertising, analytics and other purposes.

The specific types of first and third party website cookies served through our platform are for essential, analytics and customization purposes.

These cookies are strictly necessary to provide you with services available through our platform and to use some of its features, such as access to secure areas. Some cookies collect information that is used either in aggregate form to help understand how the platform is being used, how effective marketing campaigns are, or to help customizing the platform for you.

Cookies are not the only way to recognize or track visitors to a website. Other, similar technologies may be used on the platform from time to time, like web beacons (sometimes called 'tracking pixels' or 'clear gifs'). These tiny graphics files containing a unique identifier enable us to recognize when someone has visited our conference platform. This allows us, for example, to improve site performance. In many instances, these technologies are reliant on cookies to function properly, and so declining cookies will impair their functioning.

You can set or amend your web browser controls to accept or refuse cookies. If you choose to reject cookies, you may still use our platform though your access to some functionality and areas may be restricted. To change your web browser settings related to cookies:
